Imperatives for Training and Games

- All players, coaches, referees and spectators are REQUIRED to wear masks (bandanas/gaiters) walking to training & games and through the greeting/initial instruction part of the session/game AND any time they would come within 6' of another person.
- During player check-in & captain's meeting (only one captain per game), all individuals are required to wear masks.
- Once players begin warming up, coaches running their training session, referees begin the game and spectators are seated in their designated area, masks are not required.



Imperatives for Training and Games

- Anytime there is a team meeting and players & coaches are not a minimum of 6' apart, masks are required.
- When the training/game is completed, all individuals, players, coaches, referees and spectators are required to wear masks moving to their cars or another field.
- Team area and spectator seating is to be marked so social distancing, 6' from another player or family, can be in play



Imperatives for Training and Games

- If the facility you use does not provide this marking, it is the responsibility of the home team to provide the markings (cones, paint, rope are examples of what can be used).
- All clubs have been sent diagrams showing the placement of the markings at the fields.



Consequences For Not Adhering

- Individuals or teams that do not follow the above guidelines will be asked to comply immediately and if they cannot or will not comply, will be asked to leave the facility.
- If this occurs at a game, and the individual does not comply, it is up to that individual's team to request they comply and if they still do not comply, they will be asked to leave. If the individual does not comply or leave, the player connected with that individual is not to participate in the training or game.
- If there is widespread disregard to the policies by a single team and/or their spectators, ISL reserves the right to forfeit the game in favor of their opponent.



How the Meeting Works

- Show the spreadsheet so everyone can see it
- Start at the first game on the list
- One game at a time, the opponents agree as is, or agree on a change
 - If opponents can't agree on the game within 1-2 minutes, moderators marks the game TBD and the teams figure it out after the meeting and report the change in a support ticket.
- Moderator make the change to the document
- Moderator signs off game as complete
- Move to next game

Next Steps

- It will take 7-10 days to input all the changes and coordinate the field assignments.
- When that is completed, we will send out a message to please review your schedule. Remember, if the time we assign the game is within a couple of hours of your request, we will just adjust the game. If the difference is greater, both teams will be communicated to to see if the new time is acceptable. If not, they will have to discuss a new time or possibly a new date.



Next Steps (continued)

- Please, do not communicate asking why you have not seen a change based on your request. There is a process and not all of your games are changed at the same time.
- With that communication, we will send a date you have to make any changes via a support ticket (there is a webinar on how to write a support ticket on the ISL Webinar & Document page) without a change fee.
- After that date, there will be a \$100 fee for any changes.
- Remember, all changes throughout the season must be communicated via a support ticket. No emails.
