COVID Protocols

- Currently authorized vaccines in the United States are highly effective at protecting vaccinated people against symptomatic and severe COVID-19. Fully vaccinated people are less likely to become infected and, if infected, to develop symptoms of COVID-19. They are at substantially reduced risk of severe illness and death from COVID-19 compared with unvaccinated people.
- Infections in fully vaccinated people (breakthrough infections) happen in only a small proportion of people who are fully vaccinated, even with the Delta variant. Moreover, when these infections occur among vaccinated people, they tend to be mild. However, preliminary evidence suggests that fully vaccinated people who do become infected with the Delta variant can be infectious and can spread the virus to others.



COVID Protocols

- Wear a mask in public indoor settings if you are in an area of substantial or high transmission. Between Aug. 3 – 9, 2021, every county in Indiana is considered to have a substantial (7 counties) or high (all remaining counties) level of transmission.
- Since carpooling takes place with many Indiana Soccer families, it is strongly recommended that all individuals carpooling wear a mask. Families should consider wearing masks while in their own cars as individual family members may have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 or a variant.
- Social distancing (minimum of 6 feet apart) should still be practiced, indoor and outdoor.
 - Coaches should make sure social distancing is respected during team meetings (pregame, halftime, or post game).
 - Benches and tents are not permitted in the team area. Players may bring individual chairs and umbrellas for individual use.
 - Social distancing between families should be respected. If a family utilizes a tent, they are not to share the tent with immediate household members.




COVID Protocols

- Greetings
 - Handshakes between players, coaches, or referees pre- or post-game should not take place.
 - Social distancing should be respected during the captains' meeting.
- People who are immunocompromised should be counseled about the potential for reduced immune responses to COVID-19 vaccines and to follow current prevention measures (including wearing a mask, staying 6 feet apart from others they don't live with, and avoiding crowds and poorly ventilated indoor spaces) regardless of their vaccination status to protect themselves against COVID-19 until advised otherwise by their healthcare provider.
- Follow any applicable federal, state, or local regulations in terms of COVID-19 protocols. They may be more restrictive.



Rosters

- ISL Roster & State Roster are identical
- A State Roster must be created first
- Club passing takes place at the State Roster level
- A player cannot be club passed until they are an approved primary player on an age-appropriate roster. Club passing is to be done by your club administrator. Your club administrator has the link with instructions on how to club pass.
- For roster questions, please contact your club administrator



Game Day Procedures

- Bring 2 copies of your ISL game card to every game, one for the center referee and one for the opposing team. There will be how to print a game card instructions on our website prior to the start of your season.
- Only players whose names are typed on the game card are eligible to play in the game. Names are not allowed to be hand-written on the game card unless permission is given to the referee by George Perry or his designee.
- Teams must make sure every player is wearing a unique number in the game. Tape may be used to adjust a jersey number for this reason.
- When this is done, the team is to make sure the player's accurate jersey number is on both game cards.



Game Day Procedures

- Present your player passes (paper and/or virtual) to the referee for check-in with the game card. The referee is to return the passes to you immediately after check-in.
- Please use recent photo, head shot only.
- All adults in the bench area are to have a coach/manager pass and their name typed on the game card.
- If DOCs have their director's card, they do not have to be on the game card.
- Pay the referees PRIOR to the game beginning.



Game Day Procedures

- Only pay those referees in attendance and for their position only.
- For a three-referee crew, if one referee is not in attendance, the home team is to supply a club AR. The club AR is to assist with ball out of play only. A two-referee system is not allowed.
- If two referees are not in attendance, each team is to supply a club AR. If the away team does not have someone, the home team will supply two Club ARs.
- Both teams are responsible for reporting scores to ISL. Scores must be reported before midnight.
- Directions are on the bottom of the game card. A QR code may be available in the future. If one appears on your game card, you will be able to use it.



Severe Weather

- In case of severe or extreme weather, all field closing announcements will be posted on the ISL website.
- Emails and Text Messages will be sent to each team as to the status of their game.
- Please remember, clubs may close their fields (**by your club's facility coordinator only**) but **only ISL** cancels games.
- If possible, **ISL may move the game to an open site.**
- ISL does not cancel games based on forecasts.




ISL Communication Protocol

- In order to assist the DOCs, who assist the ISL Commissioner in managing the league, it is recommended that teams communicate through their DOC or another designated person within your club if your club does not have an appointed DOC.
- If you are having difficulty with another team, with the rules, policies, etc., communicate this to your DOC. The DOC will communicate this to the ISL Commissioner.
- If your issues are administrative, i.e., wrong scores, game changes..., you can communicate that directly to the league through the SUPPORT TICKET option.

- Please remember, maximum of four players may club pass up in play format to any one team.
- These players must be rostered as primary players to their original team before they can be club passed up.
- Complete the form, Player Exception Application in the ISL Webinars & Document page.
- Have your club administrator upload the document (information is being sent to them on how to).

This form is to be filled out by a Club DOC seeking an 8U player (4v4) to play on a 10U team (7v7), a 10U player (7v7) to play on an 11U or 12U team (9v9) or an 11U or 12U player to play on a 13U team (11v11). All players playing small sided games are not allowed to intentionally head the ball.

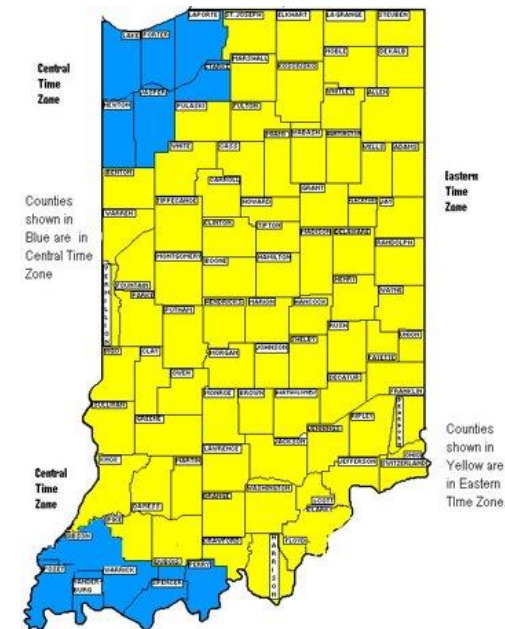


ISL Game Times

Time Zones

- Game times in the Public View schedule, gotSPORT will tell you if it is EDT or CDT.
- If you look at the schedule through your team account, pay attention to the time and time zone.
- To avoid confusion, look at the public view

Miscellaneous

- No team is permitted to play two 11 aside games in one day or three 11 aside games in one weekend (Fri, Sat, Sun). In 2nd, 3rd, 4th fall only, Evansville teams playing in a central play group are permitted to schedule two games in one day. There is to be a minimum of three hours between the end of the first game and the beginning of the second game.
- 11U & 12U teams may play two games in one day. There is to be a minimum of three hours between the end of the first game and the beginning of the second game.
- If a play group has combined age groups, the referee fee paid will be to the higher age, i.e., if the age group is 14/15U, the 15U referee fee will be paid.



Fees

- League Fees are due this weekend. We will give teams/clubs until September 1 before the late fee is added.
- It will take approximately one week to input all the changes from the scheduling meetings. We will post the updated schedule link on the ISL website when the schedules are completely updated.
- From the time the update schedules are posted until Saturday, Sept. 4, 11:59pm, for teams to submit changes to your schedule in a support ticket without the \$100 change fee.
- If a team postpones a game within 48 hours of the game, they will be responsible for the entire referee fee plus the change fee. These fees will show in the support ticket you submitted for the postponement.
