### Fall 2014 Season sees ISL playing:

MRL, Premier, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Divisions: U13 and U14

2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Divisions: U11 and U12

U10 now includes the U9s and U8s. They are divided into 4 ability groups to best assist their development. Clubs are able to move their players around to make their game experience as positive as possible. Teams' games within a club are scheduled on the same dates and same locations with a few examples at the highest play level.

### Spring 2015 Season sees all the same divisions as the Fall plus:

MRL, Premier, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Divisions: U15 – U18

The growth of the existing programs will begin to slow down unless there is an upswing in participation in soccer in the state. With that said, we do believe we can grow but helping keep players actively involved in the game for a longer period of time. We will be exploring:
