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WHAT IS ODP?

A nationwide program to identify and provide opportunities for high potential players, facilitate their development, expose them to various levels and motivate their pursuit of excellence.

Indiana ODP exists to help players reach their full potential and pursue their unique soccer journey. Whether a player's aspiration is to make the high school varsity team, compete at the highest club levels, earn Regional or National Team recognition, play college soccer, or advance to the professional game, Indiana ODP provides a pathway for growth, development, and achievement.



ODP IS AN INDIVIDUAL PATHWAY TO ACCOMPANY A TEAM (CLUB, HS, ETC...)

One of the most common misconceptions about ODP is that players must choose between ODP and their club or high school team. This is not the case. ODP is intended to **work alongside club and school soccer**, providing additional opportunities for player development, evaluation, and advancement. We value the important role clubs and schools play in a player's journey and strive to complement those experiences rather than compete with them.



WHO CAN JOIN ODP?

- The Olympic Development Program (ODP) is open to dedicated soccer players who are looking to further develop their skills and compete with and against other top players from across the state.
- For the 2026-2027 season players born within 2010-2016 are encouraged to attend tryouts, regardless of club affiliation. ODP complements a player's club experience by providing additional training, high-level competition, and opportunities for identification at the regional and national levels.
- All players in Indiana ODP will still be grouped by their birth year.
- Indiana ODP encourages all players to try out and participate, regardless of the league their club team plays in.
